HOSTEL AND MESS RULES (HOSTEL OFFICE COPY)

rules and regulations of the Hostel will render	me liable to disciplinary action including expulsion
from the Hostel.	

I am seeking admission to the Hostel in full knowledge of the Hostel/Mess rules as under:

Hostel Rules:

- 1. Resident students are strictly forbidden to visit the hostel rooms of members of opposite sex.
- 2. Use of narcotics consumption of alcoholic beverages and gambling at the hostel premises are strictly prohibited.
- 3. Playing of audio equipment in the rooms as well as in the student's common rooms shall be kept at a low pitch so that it does not disturb other residents.
- 4. For both Boy's and Girl's Hostels no late night entry will be permitted beyond 11.00 P.M. and only one night out per week be allowed for visiting friends and relatives on the specific prior permission of the Hostel Authorities/ Dy. Warden/ Honorary Warden of the Hostel.
- 5. The visitor of the same gender will be required to enter his/ her name; address and the time of entry in the register kept at the Reception of the Hostels and also identify himself/ herself through I-Card etc. whenever asked by the Security Guard/ Chowkidar/ Caretaker/ Dy. Warden/ Honorary Warden of the Hostel.
- 6. The Hostellers are forbidden to play any game in lawns/ open spaces outside the Hostel building that may cause damage to the properly of the School and disturb or cause discomfort and inconvenience to other residents.
- 7. Hostel Office at I.P. Estate (ITO) and Estate Office at Maharani Bagh may provide bulbs and tubes in a limited number to individual rooms if available in the School Store.
- 8. The residents shall not spoil, deface the walls, furniture and cupboards etc. They shall also not alter or temper with electric wiring and fittings. In case some damages are done he/she shall be liable for three times recovery of the value assigned by the Hostel Authorities and disciplinary action as decided by the competent authorities.



- 9. Hostel resident shall stay in the room allotted to him/ her and would not be permitted to shift room in case such incident is brought to the notice his/ her room allotment will be cancelled. The Hostel allotment is non-transferable. The entry of Non-Hostellers/Day Scholars are not allowed to stay in the Hostel premises without written permission of the Hostel Warden. If any student(s) is found to violates this rule disciplinary action shall be taken against him/her, including recovery of full Hostel Charges with fine.
- 10. Hostel resident shall shift to another room of vacate the Hostel if required/ directed by the Honorary Hostel Warden for decision taken in the interest of the School.
- 11. Resident students shall observe decency and decorum in the Hostel and generate a healthy and wholesome environment. Any act of intimidation, violence or willful damage shall be liable for disciplinary action by Hostel Authorities.
- 12. Resident who expect to be away from the Hostel for a short period exceeding one day shall inform the Warden Deputy Warden of his/ her absence, indicating their contact address and the probable time of their return. If they fail to do so disciplinary action may be initiated.
- 13. Resident student shall vacate rooms immediately on the completion of the academic term and hand over the charge of the room including all the items of furniture/ fixtures supplied to them onadmission to the Hostel, to the Hostel Caretaker or any otherofficial of the hostel authorized by the Honorary Hostel Warden.
- 14. Inmates are required to keep their personal belongings in their safe custody. Any theft or loss of such personal items would be the sole responsibility of the hostel inmate.
- 15. As per notification of the Govt. of India regarding damage to property and equipment in the institution as a result of any demonstrations/ strikes charges would have to be recovered directly from those students involved in such incidents as may be decided by the competent authority and face disciplinary action too.

Mess Rules:

- 1. Mess is compulsory for all the hostellers.
- 2. All the Hostellers will be issued Mess Coupons with respective date, meal type and meal preference, which will have to be handed over to the authorized person of the Mess against which the meal will be served.
- 3. If any hosteller does not want to dine in the Mess, he / she has to seek special permission from the Honorary Hostel Warden with sufficient medical proof subject to verification by the Medical officers/Board of the School. The permission will be given on the basis of written application with valid reason and returning the coupons for the period, before commencement of the period.
- **4.** For those permitted, Rs.500/- (Rupees Five hundred only) as Non-Dining Charges (NDC) per month will be charged. No Meal shall be served to the Hostellers who have opted for Mess Off / NDC.
- 5. No student is allowed to take Mess utensils outside the Hostel Dining Room if anybody is found taking utensils outside the Mess, he/ she shall be fined Rs.100/- (Rupees Hundred only).



- **6.** Food will be served by Hostel Mess Employees in the room, on demand (minimum 3 hours' notice is required) only to the sick students.
- 7. Guestsofstudents, staffandmembersoffaculty will onlybeprovided service against coupons purchased in advance in the dining hall only of the respective Mess.
- 8. Rebate for pre-paid Mess Coupons may be allowed provided three days' notice and return of Mess Coupons in advance, given under the following conditions:
 - Outstation tours (Educational/ Study Tours/ Training/ Academic related activities) with applications approved through HOD.
 - Minimum 2 days upto a maximum 8 days per month of authorized absence from Hostel for which period approval of Honorary Hostel Warden is required.

REGULATIONS 2016

(Under Section 26 (1) (g) of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956) F.1-16/2007 (CPP-II) Dated 17th June, 2009 (as amended 1. dt 08.10.2012, 2. dt 25.12.2013 and 3. dt 29.062016)

PREAMBLE

Inview ofthedirectionsofthe Hon'bleSupremeCourtinthe matterof "University of Kerala v/s. Council, Principals, Collegesandothers" in SLPno.24295 of 2006 dated 16.05.2007 and thatdated 8.05.2009 in Civil Appealnumber 887 of 2009, and inconsideration of the determination of the Central Government and the University Grants Commission to prohibit, prevent and eliminate the scourge of ragging includinganyconductbyanystudentorstudentswhetherbywordsspokenorwrittenorbyanactwhichhas theeffectorteasing, treating orhandlingwithrudenessa fresheroranyotherstudent, orindulginginrowdyorindisciplinedactivitiesbyanystudentorstudentswhich causesorislikelytocauseannoyance, hardship orpsychologicalharmortoraisefearorapprehension thereofinanyfresheroranyother studentorasking any student to do any actwhich such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generatingasenseofshame, ortormentorembarrassmentsoastoadversely affectthephysiqueorpsycheofsuch fresheroranyother student, withorwithoutanintenttoderiveasadisticpleasureorshowingoffpower, authorityorsuperioritybyastudentoveranyfresher oranyotherstudent, in allhighereducation institutionsinthecountry, andthereby, toprovideforthehealthy development, physically and psychologically, ofallstudents, the University Grants Commission, inconsultation with the Councils, bringsforth this Regulation.

In exercise of the powers conferred by Clause (g) of sub-section (1) of Section 26 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956, the University Grants Commission hereby makes the following Regulations, namely;

1. Title, commencement and applicability:

- 1.1 Theseregulationsshallbecalledthe "Curbingthe Menaceof Raggingin HigherEducational Institutions, Regulations".
- 1.2 They shall come into force form the date of their publication in the official Gazette.
- 1.3 Theyshallapplytoallthe Institutionscomingwithinthedefinition of an University undersub-section (f) ofsection (2) of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956, and to all institutions deemedtobe university under Section 3 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956, toallotherhighereducationalinstitutions, orelements of suchuniversities or institutions, including its departments, constituent units and all the premises, whether being academic, residential, playgrounds, canteen, or other such premises of such universities, deemed universities and higher educational institutions, whether located within the campus or outside, and to all means of transportation of students, whether public or private, accessed by students for the pursuit of studies in such universities, deemed universities and higher educational institutions.

2. Objectives:

Toprohibitany conductbyanystudentofstudentswhetherbywordsspoken orwritten orbyan actwhich hastheeffectof teasing, treating orhandling with rudeness a fresherorany otherstudent, or indulginginrowdyorindisciplined activitiesbyanystudent or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof inanyfresherorany other student orasking any student to do any actwhich such studentwillnotinthe ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique orpsycheofsuch fresheroranyotherstudent, with orwithoutanintenttoderiveasadisticpleasureorshowingoffpower, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student; and thereby, to eliminate ragging in all its forms from universities, deemed universities and other higher educational institutions in the country by prohibiting it under these Regulations, preventing its occurrence and punishing those who indulge in ragging as provided forin these Regulations and the appropriate law in force.

3. What constitutes Ragging

Ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following acts:

- a. anyconductby anystudentor studentswhether by wordsspoken or written or by anactwhich hastheeffect orteasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student;
- b. indulginginrowdyorindisciplined activitiesbyany studentorstudentswhich causesorislikelytocauseannoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student;
- asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student;
- d. any act by senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher;

- e. exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
- f. any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students;
- g. any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person'
- h. any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student;
- i. any act that effects the mental health and self-confidence of fresher or any other student;
- j. any act of physical or mental abuse (including bullying and exclusion) targeted at another student (fresher or otherwise) on the ground of colour, race, religion, caste, ethnicity, gender (including transgender), sexual orientation, appearance, nationality, regionalorigins, linguisticidentity, placeofbirth, place of residence or economicbackground.

Withorwithoutanintenttoderiveasadisticpleasureorshowingoffpower, authority or superiority by a student overany fresher or any other student.

4. Definitions:

- 1) In these regulations unless the context otherwise requires,
 - a) "Act" means, the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 (3 of 1956):
 - b) "Academic year" means the .period from the commencement of admission of students in any course of study in the institution up to the completion of academic requirements for that particular year.'
 - c) "Anti-Ragging Help line" means the Help line established under clause(a) of Regulation 8.1 of these Regulations.
 - d) "Commission" means the University Grants Commission'
 - e) "Council" means a body so constituted by an Actof Parliament or an Act of any State Legislature forsetting, or co-ordinating or maintaining standards in the relevant areas of higher education, such as the All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE), the Bar Council of India (BCI), the Dental Council of India (DCI), the Distance Education Council (DEC), the Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR), the Indian Nursing Council (INC), the Medial Council of India (MCI), the National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE), the Pharmacy Council of India (PCI), etc. and the State Higher Education Councils.
 - f) "District Level Anti-Ragging Committee" means the Committee, headed by the District Magistrate, constituted by the State Government, forthe control and elimination of raggingininstitutions within the jurisdiction of the district.
 - g) "Head of the Institution" means the Vice-Chancellor in case of a university or a deemed to be university, the Principal or the Directororsuchotherdesignation astheexecutivehead of theinstitution or the collegeis referred.
 - h) "Fresher" meansastudentwhohasbeenadmitted toaninstitution andwhoisundergoinghis/herfirstyearofstudy in such institution.
 - i) "Institution" means a highereducational institution including, but not limited to an university, deemed to be university, a college, an institute, an institution of national importance set up by an Act of Parliament or constituent unitof such institution, imparting highereducation beyond 12 years of schoolingleadingto, butnotnecessarily culminating in, adegree(graduate, postgraduateand/or higher level) and/ortoauniversitydiploma.
 - j) "NAAC" means the National Academic and Accreditation Council established by the Commission under section 12(ccc) of theAct'
 - k) "State Level Monitoring Cell" means the body constituted by the State Government for the control and elimination ofragging in institutions within the jurisdiction of the State, established undera State Law oron the advice of the Central Government, as the case may be.
- 2) words and expressions used and not defined herein but defined in the Act or in the General Clauses Act, 1897, shall have the meanings respectively assigned to them in the Act or in the General Clauses Act, 1897, as the case may be.

5. Measures for prohibition of ragging at the institution level:

- Noinstitution orany part of it thereof,including its elements,including,but notlimited to, the departments, constituent units,colleges,centersofstudiesand allitspremises,whetheracademic,residential,playgrounds,orcanteen,whether located within the campus or outside, and in all means of transportation of students, whether public or private, accessed by students for the pursuit of studies in such institutions, shall permit or condone any reported incident of ragging in any form; and all institutions shall take all necessary and required measures, including but not limited to the provisions of these Regulations, to achieve the objective of eliminating ragging, within the institution or outside,
- b) All institutions shall take action in accordance with these Regulations against those found guilty of ragging and/or abetting ragging, actively or passively, or being part of a conspiracy to promote ragging.

6. Measures for prevention of ragging at the institution level:

- 6.1 An institution shall take the following steps in regard to admission or registration of students; namely,
 - a) Every publicdeclaration of intent by any institution, in any electronic, audio-visual or print or any other media, for admission of students to any course of study shall expressly provide that ragging is totally prohibited in the institution and anyone found guilty ofragging and/or abetting, whetheractively orpassively, or being a part of a conspiracy to promoteragging, isliable tobe punished in accordance with these Regulations aswell asunder the provision of any penal law for the time being in force.
 - b) The brochure of admission/instruction booklet or theprospectus, whether inprint orelectronicformat, shall

prominently print these Regulations in full.

Provided that the institution shall also draw attention to any law concerning ragging and its consequences, as may be applicable to the institution publishing such brochure of admission/instruction book let or the prospectus.

Providedfurtherthat thetelephonenumbersofthe Anti- Ragging Helplineandalltheimportantfunctionaries intheinstitution, including but not limited to the head of the institution, faculty members, members of the Anti-Ragging Committees and Anti-Ragging Squads, District and Sub- Divisional authorities, Wardens of hostels, and other functionaries or authorities where relevant, shall be published in the brochure of admission/instruction booklet or the prospectus.

- c) Wherean institution isaffiliated toa University andpublishesabrochure of admission/instruction booklet ora prospectus, the affiliating university shall ensure that the affiliated institution shall comply with the provisions of clause (a) and clause (b) of Regulation 6.1 of these Regulations.
- d) Theapplication formforadmission,enrolmentorregistration shallcontain anaffidavit, mandatoryin English and in Hindi and/or in one of the regional languages known to the applicant, as provided in the English language in Annexure I to these Regulations, tobe filledupand signed by the applicant to the effect thathe/she has read and understood theprovisionsoftheseRegulationsaswellastheprovisionsofanyotherlawforthe timebeinginforce, and isawareofthe prohibition ofraggingandthepunishments prescribed, bothunderpenallaws aswellasunder these Regulations and also affirm to the effect that he/she has not been expelled and/or debarred by any institution andfurtheraverthathe/she wouldnotindulge, actively orpassively,intheactorabettheactofraggingandiffound guilty of raggingand/or abetting ragging, isliabletobeproceededagainstunderthese Regulations or under any penal law orany other law for the time being in force and such action would include butisnotlimited to debarment or expulsion of such student.
- e) The application form for admission, enrolment or registration shall contain an affidavit, mandatory in English and in Hindi and/or in one of the regional languages known to the parents guardians of the applicant as provided in the English languagein Annexure I to these Regulations, tobefilled up and signed by the parents / guardians of the applicant to the effect that/he/she has read and understood the provisions of these Regulations as well as the provisionsof anyother law for the time being in force, and is aware of the prohibition of ragging and the punishments prescribed, both under penallaws as well as under these Regulations and also affirm to the effect that his/herward has not been expelled and/or debarred by any institution and further aver that his/her ward would not indulge, actively or passively, in the actorabet the actor ragging and iffound guilty of ragging and/or abetting ragging, his/her ward is liable to be proceeded against under these Regulations or under any penal law or any other law for the time being in force and such action would include but is not limited to debarment or expulsion of his/her ward.
- f) Theapplication foradmission shallbeaccompaniedbyadocumentintheform of,orannexedto, theSchool Leaving Certificate/Transfer Certificate/Migration Certificate/ Character Certificate reporting on the inter -personal/social behaviouralpattern of the applicant, tobeissued by the school orinstitution lastattended bythe applicant, so that theinstitution can thereafterkeepwatch on theapplicant, ifadmitted, whosebehaviour has been commented in such document.
- g) A student seeking admission to a hostel forming part of the institution, or seeking to reside in any temporary premises notformingpart of theinstitution, including a private commercially managed lodgeorhostel, shall have to submit additional affidavits countersigned by his/her parents/ guardians in the form prescribed in Annexure I and Annexure II to these Regulations respectively along with his/her application.
- h) Beforethe commencementof theacademic session inanyinstitution, the Head of theinstitution shallconveneand address a meeting of various functionaries/agencies, such as Hostel Wardens, representatives of students, parents/guardians, faculty, district administration including the police, to discuss the measures to be taken to prevent ragging inthe institution and stepstobetaken to identifythoseindulging in or abettingraggingandpunish them.
- i) Theinstitution, shall, to make the community atlarge and the students in particular aware of the dehumanizing effect of ragging, and the approach of the institution towards those indulging in ragging, prominently display posters depictingthe provisionsofpenallaw applicabletoincidentsof ragging, andtheprovisions ofthese Regulations and alsoany otherlawforthetimebeinginforce, andthepunishmentsthereof, shallbeprominentlydisplayed onNotice Boardsofalldepartments, hostelsand otherbuildingsas wellasatplaces, wherestudents normally gather and at places, known to be vulnerable to occurrences of ragging incidents.
- j) The institution shall request the media to give adequate publicity to the law prohibiting ragging and the negative aspects of ragging and the institution's resolve to ban ragging and punish those found guilty without fear or favour.
- k) The institution shall identify, properly illuminate and keep a close watch on all locationsknown to be vulnerable to occurrences of ragging incidents.
- The institution shall tighten security in its premises, especially at vulnerable places and intense policing by Anti-Ragging Squad, referred to in these Regulations and volunteers, if any, shall be resorted to at such points at odd hours during the first few months of the academic session.
- m) The institution shall utilize the vacation period before the start ofthe new academicyearto launch a publicity campaign against ragging through posters, leaflets and such other means, as may be desirable or required, to promote the objectives of these Regulations.
- n) The faculties/departments/units of the institution shall have induction arrangements, including those which anticipate, identify and plan to meetany special needs of any specificsection of students, in place well in advance of the beginning of the academic year with an aim to promote the objectives of this Regulation.
- o) Everyinstitution shallengage orseek the assistance ofprofessional counsellorsbefore the commencement ofthe academic session, to be available when required by the institution, for the purposes of offering counselling to fresher and to other students after the commencement of the academic year,
- p) The headoftheinstitution shallprovideinformation tothelocalpoliceandlocalauthorities, thedetails of every

privatelycommercially managed hostels or lodges used for residential purposes by students enrolled in the institution and the head of the institution shall also ensure that the Anti-Ragging Squad shall ensure vigil in such locations to prevent the occurrence of ragging therein.

- 6.2 An institution shall, on admission or enrolment or registration of students, take the following steps, namely;
 - a) Everyfresh studentadmitted totheinstitution shallbegivena printedleafletdetailingtowhomhe/she hastoturnto forhelpandguidanceforvariouspurposes includingaddressesandtelephonenumbers, soastoenablethe student tocontacttheconcerned person atanytime,ifandwhenrequired, of the Anti-Ragging Helplinereferredto inthese Regulations, Wardens, Head oftheinstitution, all membersof theanti-raggingsquadsandcommittees, relevant district and police authorities.
 - b) Theinstitution, through theleafletspecifiedinclause (a)of Regulation6.2 of these Regulations shallexplainto the freshers, the arrangements made for their induction and orientation which promote efficient and effective means of integrating them fully asstudents with those already admitted to the institution in earlier years.
 - c) The leaflet specified in clause (a) of Regulation 6.2 of these Regulations shall inform the freshers about their rights as bonafidestudentsof theinstitution and clearlyinstructing them thatthey shoulddesist from doing anything, with or against theirwill, evenif ordered to by the seniors students, and that anyattempt of ragging shall be promptly reported to the Anti-ragging Squadorto the Warden or to the Headoftheinstitution, as the casemay be.
 - d) Theleafletspecified inclause(a) of Regulation 6.2 ofthese Regulations shallcontaina calendar of events and activities laid down by the institution to facilitate and complement familiarization of freshers with the academic environment of the institution.
 - e) Theinstitution shall, on thearrivalof seniorstudentsafterthefirstweekorafterthesecondweek,asthecasemay be,scheduleorientationprogrammersasfollows, namely;(i) jointsensitization programme and counselling of bothfreshersandseniorstudentsbya professional counsellor, referred to inclause(o) of Regulation 6.1 of these Regulations; (ii) joint orientation programme of freshers and seniors to be addressed by the Head of the institution and the anti-ragging committee; (iii) organization on a large scale of cultural, sports and other activities to provide a platform for the freshers and seniors to interact in the presence of faculty members; (iv) in the hostel, the warden should address all students; and may request two junior colleagues from the college faculty to assist the warden by becoming resident tutors for a temporary duration, (v) as far as possible faculty members should dine with the hostel residents in their respective hostels to instil a feeling of confidence among the freshers.
 - f) The institution shall set up appropriate committees, including the course-in-charge, student advisor, Wardens and some senior students as its members, to actively monitor, promote and regulate healthy interaction between the freshers, junior students and senior students.
 - g) Freshers or any other student(s), whether being victims, or witnesses, in any incident of ragging, shall be encouraged to report such occurrence, and the identity of such informants shall be protected and shall notbe subject to any adverse consequence only for the reason' for having reported such incidents.
 - h) Each batchof freshers, onarrivalatthe institution, shallbe dividedinto smallgroupsand each suchgroup shallbe assigned to a member of the faculty, who shallinteract individually with each member of the groupevery day for ascertaining the problems or difficulties, if any, faced by the fresher in the institution and shall extend necessary help to the fresher in overcoming the same.
 - i) Itshall be the responsibility of the member of the faculty assigned to the group of freshers, to coordinate with the Wardens of the hostels andtomake surprise visits to the rooms insuch hostels, wherea member or membersof the group are lodged; and such member of faculty shall maintain a diary of his/her interaction with the freshers under his/her charge.
 - j) Freshersshall be lodged, as farasmay be,in a separate hostel block, and where such facilities are notavailable, the institution shall ensure that access of seniors to accommodation allotted to freshers is strictly monitored by wardens, security quards and other staff of the institution.
 - k) A round the clock vigil against ragging in the hostel premises, in order to prevent ragging in the hostel after the classes are over, shall be ensured by the institution.
 - I) It shall be the responsibility of the parents/guardians of freshers to promptly bring any instance of ragging to the notice of the Head of the institution.
 - m) Every student studying in the institution and his/her parents/ guardians shall provide the specific affidavits required underclauses(d),(e)and (g) of Regulation6.1 oftheseRegulations at the timeofadmission orregistration, as the case may be, during each academic year.
 - n) Every institution shall obtain the affidavit from every student as referred to above in clause (m) of Regulation 6.2 and maintain a proper record of the same and to ensure its safe upkeep thereof, including maintaining the copies of the affidavitinanelectronic form, to be accessed easily when required either by the Commission or any of the Councilsor by the institution or by the affiliating University or by any other person or organization authorized to do so.
 - o) Every studentat the time of his/her registration shall inform the institution about his/her place of residence while pursuing the course of study, and in case the student hasnotdecided his/her place of residence or intends to change the same,, the details of his place of residence shall be provided immediately on deciding the same; and specifically in regard to a private commercially managed lodge or hostel where he/she hastaken up residence.
 - p) The Head of the institution shall, on the basis of the information provided by the student under clause (o) of Regulation 6.2, apportion sectors to be assigned to members of the faculty, so that such member of faculty can maintain vigil and report any incident of ragging outside the campus or enroute while commuting to the institution using any means of transportation of students, whether public or private.
 - q) The Head of the institution shall, at the end of each academic year, send a letter to the parents/guardians of the students who are completing their first year in the institution, informing them about these Regulations and any law

for the time being in force prohibiting ragging and the punishments thereof as well as punishments prescribed under thepenallaws, and appealing them toimpressupon theirwards desistfromindulginginragging on theirreturn to the institution at the beginning of the academic session next.

6.3 Every institution shall constitute the following bodies; namely:

- a) Everyinstitution shallconstitute a Committee to beknown as the Anti-RaggingCommittee to be nominated and headed by the Head of the institution, and consisting of representatives of civil and police administration, local media, Non Government Organizations involved in youth activities, representatives of faculty members, representatives of parents, representatives of students belonging to the freshers' category as well as senior students, non-teaching staff; and shallhave a diverse mix of membership in terms of levels as well asgender.
- b) It shall be the duty of the Anti-Ragging Committee to ensure compliance with the provisions of these Regulations as wellas the provisions of any law for the time being inforce concerning ragging; and also to monitorand oversee the performance of the Anti-Ragging Squad in prevention of ragging in the institution.
- c) Everyinstitution shallalso constitute a smallerbody to beknown as theAnti-Ragging Squad to benominated by the Head of the Institution with such representation as may be considered necessary for maintaining vigil, oversight and patrolling functions and shall remain mobile, alert and active at all times.
 - Provided that the Anti-Ragging Squad shall have representation of various members of the campus community and shall have no outside representation.
- d) Itshallbethedutyofthe Anti-Ragging Squadtobecalledupon tomakesurpriseraidsonhostels, andotherplaces vulnerable to incidents of, and having the potential of, raggingand shall beempowered to inspectsuch places.
- e) Itshallalso bethe duty of the Anti-Ragging Squadto conductan on-the-spotenquiryinto anyincidentofragging referred to itbythe Head of theinstitution orany member of the facultyorany member of the staff orany student oranyparentorguardian oranyemployee ofaserviceproviderorby anyotherperson, asthecasemay be; and the enquiryreportalongwithrecommendationsshallbesubmitted to the Anti-Ragging Committeeforaction under clause (a) of Regulation 9.1.
 - Provided that the Anti-Ragging Squad shall conduct such enquiry observing a fair and transparent procedure and the principles of natural justice and after giving adequate opportunity to the student or students accused of ragging and other witnesses to place before it the facts, documents and views concerning the incident of ragging, and considering such other relevant information as may required.
- f) Everyinstitution shall, attheend of each academic year,in orderto promote the objectives of these Regulations, constitute a Mentoring Cell consisting of students volunteering to be Mentors for freshers, in the succeeding academic year; and there shall beasmanylevels ortiers of Mentors as the number ofbatches in the institution, atthe rate of one Mentor for six freshers and one Mentor of a higher level for six Mentors of the lower level.
- g) Every University shallconstitutea bodytobeknown as Monitoring Cellon Ragging, which shallcoordinatewiththe affiliated colleges and institutions under the domain of the University to achieve the objectives of these Regulations; and the Monitoring Cell shall call for reports from the Heads of institutions in regard to the activities of the Anti-Ragging Committee, Anti-Ragging Squads, and the Mentoring Cellsattheinstitutions, and its hall also keep itself abreast of the decisions of the Districtlevel Anti-Ragging Committee headed by the District Magistrate.
- h) The Monitoring Cell shall also review the efforts made by institutions to publicize anti-ragging measures, soliciting of affidavits from parents/guardians and from students, each academic year, to abstain from ragging activities or willingnesstobe penalized for violations; and shallfunction asthe prime mover forinitiating action on the part of the appropriate authorities of the university for amending the Statutes or Ordinances or Bye-laws to facilitate implementation of anti-ragging measures at the level of the institution.

6.4 Every institution shall take the following other measures, namely;

- a) Each hostel or a place where groups of students reside, forming part of the institution, shall have a full-time Warden, to be appointed by the institution asperthe eligibility criteria laid down for the post reflecting both the command and control aspectsofmaintaining disciplineandpreventingincidents orraggingwithin the hostel, as wellas the softer skills of counselling and communicating with the youth outside the class-room situation; and who shall reside within the hostel, or at the very least, in the close vicinity thereof.
- b) The Warden shallbe accessibleatallhoursand beavailableon telephoneand othermodes of communication, and for the purpose the Warden shall be provide with a mobile phone by the institution, the number of which shall be publicized among all students residing in the hostel.
- c) The institution shall review and suitably enhance the powers of Wardens; and the security personnel posted in hostels shall be under the direct control of the Warden and their performance shall be assessed by them.
- d) Theprofessional counsellors referredtounderclause (o) ofRegulation6.1 ofthese regulationsshall,atthe timeof admission,counselfreshersand/oranyotherstudent(s)desiring counselling,inordertoprepare themforthe life ahead, particularly in regard to the life in hostels and to the extent possible, also involve parents and teachers in the counselling sessions.
- e) The institution shall undertake measures forextensive publicity againstragging by means ofaudio-visual aids, counselling sessions, workshops, painting and design competitions among students and such other measures, as it may deem fit.
- f) In orderto enable a studentorany person to communicate with the Anti-Ragging Helpline, every institution shall permit unrestricted access to mobile phones and public phones in hostels and campuses, other than in classrooms, seminar halls, library, and in such other places that the institution may deem it necessary to restrict the use of phones
- g) The faculty of the institution and its non-teaching staff, which includes but is not limited to the administrative staff, contract employees, security guards and employees of service providers providing services within the institution,

- shall be sensitized towards the ills of ragging, its prevention and the consequences thereof.
- h) Theinstitution shall obtain an undertaking from every employee of the institution including all teaching and non-teaching members of staff, contract labour employed in the premises either for running canteen or as watch and ward stafforforcleaning or maintenance of thebuilding/ lawnsandemployees of serviceprovidersproviding services within institution, that he/she would reportpromptly any case of ragging which comes to his/her notice.
- i) The institution shall make a provision in the service rules of its employees for issuing certificates of appreciation to suchmembers of the staff who reportincidents of ragging, which will form part of their service record.
- j) The institution shall give necessary instructions to the employees of the canteens and messing, whether that of the institution or that of a service provider providing this service, or their-employers, as the case may be, to keep a strict vigil inthe area of their work and to report the incidents of ragging to the Head of the institution or members of the Anti-Ragging Squad or member of the Anti-Ragging Committee or the Wardens, asmayberequired.
- k) All Universities awarding a degree in education atanylevel, shallbe requiredtoensure thatinstitutionsimparting instructionin suchcourses or conducting trainingprogramme forteachersincludeinputs relating to anti-ragging and the appreciation of the relevant human rights, as well as inputs on topics regarding sensitization against corporal punishments and checking of bullying amongst students, so thatevery teacheris equipped tohandle at least the rudiments of the counselling approach.
- I) Discreet random surveys shall be conducted amongst the freshers every fortnight during the first three months of the academicyearto verify andcross-checkwhethertheinstitution isindeedfreeof raggingornotandforthepurpose the institution may design its own methodology of conducting such surveys.
- m) Theinstitution shallcausetohaveanentry, apartfrom those relatingtogeneral conductand behaviour, made in the Migration/Transfer Certificate issued to the student while leaving the institution, as to whether the student has been Punished for committing or abetting an act of ragging, as also whether the student has displayed persistent violent or aggressive behaviour or any inclination to harm others, during his course of study in the institution.
- n) Notwithstanding anything contained in these Regulations with regard to obligations and responsibilities pertaining to the authorities or members of bodies prescribed above, it shall be the general collective responsibility of all levels and sections ofauthoritiesorfunctionariesincluding membersof thefacultyandemployeesoftheinstitution. Whether regular or temporary, and employees of service providers providing service within the institution, to prevent or to act promptly against the occurrence of ragging or any incident of ragging which comes to their notice.
- o) The Heads of institutions affiliated to a University or a constituent of the University, as the case may be, shall, during thefirstthree monthsofanacademic year, submit aweeklyreportonthe status of compliance with Anti-Ragging measures under these Regulations, and a monthlyreporton such status thereafter, to the Vice-Chancellor of the University to which the institution is affiliated to or recognized by.
- p) The Vice-Chancellor of each University, shall submit fortnightly reports of the University, including those of the Monitoring Cell on Ragging in case of an affiliating university, to the State Level Monitoring Cell.

7. Action to be taken by the Head of the institution:

On receipt of the recommendation of the Anti Ragging Squad or on receipt of any information concerning any reported incident • of ragging, the Headofinstitution shallimmediately determineifa caseunderthepenallawsis madeoutandif so, eitheron hisown or througha member of the Anti-Ragging Committeeauthorized by himinthis behalf, proceedtofilea First Information Report (FIR), within twenty fourhoursofreceiptofsuchinformation or recommendation, with the policeand local authorities, under the appropriate penal provisions relating to one or more of the following, namely;

- i. Abetment to ragging;
- ii. Criminal conspiracy to rag;
- iii. Unlawful assembly and rioting while ragging;
- iv. Public nuisance created during ragging;
- v. Violation of decency and morals through ragging;
- vi. Injury to body, causing hurt or grievous hurt;
- vii. Wrongful restraint;
- viii. Wrongful confinement;
- ix. Use of criminal force;
- x. Assault as well as sexual offences or unnatural offences;
- xi. Extortion
- xii. Criminal trespass;
- xiii. Offences against property;
- xiv. Criminal intimidation;
- xv. Attempts to commit any or all of the above mentioned offences against the victim(s)
- xvi. Threat to commit any or all of the above mentioned offences against the victim(s)
- xvii. Physical or psychological humiliation;
- xviii. All other offences following from the definition of "Ragging".

Provided that the Head of the institution shall for thwith report the occurrence of the institution is an affiliating University, if the institution is an affiliated institution.

Providedfurtherthattheinstitution shallalsocontinue withitsownenquiry initiatedunderclause 9 of these Regulationsand

othermeasureswithoutwaitingforaction on thepart ofthepolice/local authorities and such remedial action shall be initiated and completed immediately and in no case later than a period of seven days of the reported occurrence of the incident of ragging.

8. Duties and Responsibilities of the Commission and the Councils:

- 8.1 The Commission shall, with regard to providing facilitating communication of information regarding incidents of ragging in any institution, take the following steps, namely;
 - a) The Commission shall establish, fund and operate, a toll-free Anti-Ragging Helpline, operational round the clock, which could be accessed by students in distress owing to ragging related incidents.
 - b) Anydistressmessagereceivedatthe Anti-Ragging Helpline shallbe simultaneously relayed to the Head of the Institution, thewarden of the Hostels, the Nodal Officer of the affiliating University, if theincident reported has taken place in an institution affiliated to a University, the concerned District authorities and if so required, the DistrictMagistrate, and the Superintendentof Police, and shallalso bewebenabled so as to be be domain simultaneously for the media and citizens to access it.
 - c) TheHead oftheinstitution shallbeobligedtoactimmediatelyinresponsetotheinformation receivedfrom the Anti-Ragging Helpline as at sub-clause (b) of this clause.
 - d) The telephone numbers of the Anti-Ragging Helpline and all the important functionaries in every institution, Heads of institutions, faculty members, members of the anti-ragging committees and anti ragging squads, district and subdivisional authorities and state authorities, Wardens of hostels, and other functionaries or authorities where relevant, shall be widely disseminated for access or to seek help in emergencies.
 - e) The Commission shall maintain an appropriate data base to be created out of affidavits, affirmed by each student and his/ herparents/guardiansand storedelectronically by the institution, either on its orthrough an agency to be designated by it; and such database shall also function as a record of ragging complaints received, and the status of the action taken thereon.
 - f) The Commission shall make available the database to a non-governmental agency to be nominated by the University Grants Commission, to build confidence in the public and also to provide information of non compliance with these Regulations to the Councils and to such bodies asmay be authorized by the Commission orby the University Grants Commission.

8.2 The Commission shall take the following regulatory steps, namely;

- a) TheCommission shall makeitmandatory fortheinstitutionstoincorporateintheirprospectus, thedirectionsof the Central Government or the State Level Monitoring Committee with regard to prohibition and consequences of ragging, and that non-compliance with these Regulations and directions so provided, shall be considered as lowering of academic standards by the institution, therefore making it liable for appropriate action.
- b) The Commission shall verify that the institutions strictly comply with the requirement of getting the affidavits from the students and their parents/guardians as envisaged under these Regulations.
- c) The Commission shallinclude a specificcondition in the UtilizationCertificate, in respectofanyfinancial assistance or grants-in-aid to any institution under any of the general or special schemes of the Commission, that the institution has complied with the anti-ragging measures.
- d) Anyincidentofragginginaninstitution shalladversely affectitsaccreditation, rankingorgradingby NAACorby any other authorized accreditation agencies while assessing the institution for accreditation, ranking or grading purposes.
- e) The Commission mayaccord priorityinfinancial grants-in-aid to thoseinstitutions, otherwiseeligibleto receive grantsundersection 12B ofthe Act, whichreporta blemishlessrecordintermsoftherebeingnoreported incident of ragging.
- f) The Commission shall constitute an Inter-Council Committee, consisting of representatives of the various Councils, the Non-Governmental agency responsible for monitoring the database maintained by the Commission under clause (f) of Regulation 8.1 and such other bodies in higher education, to coordinate and monitor the anti-ragging measures ininstitutionsacrossthecountryandtomakerecommendationsfromtimetotime; and shall meetatle astonce in six months each year.
- g) The Commission shall institute an Anti-Ragging Cell within the Commission as an institutional mechanism to provide secretarial support for collection ofinformation and monitoring, and tocoordinate with the State Level Monitoring Celland University level Committees for effective implementation of anti-ragging measures, and the cell shall also coordinate with the Non-Governmental agency responsible for monitoring the database maintained by the Commission appointed under clause (g) of Regulation 8.1.

9. Administrative action in the event of ragging.-

- 9.1 The institution shall punish a student found guilty of ragging after following the procedure and in the manner prescribed herein under:
 - a) The Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution shall take an appropriate decision, in regard to punishment or otherwise, depending on the facts of each incident of ragging and nature and gravity of the incident of ragging established in the recommendations of the Anti-Ragging Squad.
 - b) The Anti-Ragging Committee may, depending on the nature and gravity of the guilt established by the Anti-Ragging Squad, award, to those found guilty, one or more of the following punishments, namely;
 - i. Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
 - ii. With holding/ withdrawing scholarship /fellowship and other benefits.
 - iii Debarring from appearing in any test/ examination or other evaluation process.

- iv. Withholding results.
- v. Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
- vi. Suspension/ expulsion from the hostel.
- vii. Cancellation of admission.
- viii. Rustication from the institution for period ranging from one to four semesters.
- ix. Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from to any other institution for a specified period.

Provided that where the persons committing or abetting the act of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.

- c) An appeal against the order of punishment by the Anti- Ragging Committee shall lie,
 - incaseofanorderofaninstitution, affiliatedtoorconstituentpart, of aUniversity, totheVice-Chancellor of the University.
 - ii. in case of an order of a University, to its Chancellor.
 - ii. incase ofan institution ofnationalimportancecreatedbyan Actof Parliament, to the Chairman or Chancellorof the institution, as the case may be.
- 9.2 Where an institution, being constituent of, affiliated to or recognized by a University, fails to comply with any of the provisions ofthese Regulations orfails to curb raggingeffectively, such University may takeanyone ormore of thefollowing actions, namely;
 - i. Withdrawal of affiliation/recognition or other privileges conferred.
 - ii. Prohibiting such institution from presenting any student or students then undergoing any programme of study therein for the award of any degree/diploma of the University.
 - Provided that where an institution is prohibited from presenting its student or students, the Commission shall make suitablearrangement forthe otherstudents so asto ensure that such students areable topursue their academic studies.
 - iii. Withholding grants allocated to it by the university, if any
 - iv. Withholding any grants chanellised through the university to the institution.
 - v. Any other appropriate penalty within the powers of the university.
- 9.3 Wherein theopinion oftheappointing authority, alapseisattributabletoany member of thefaultyorstaff oftheinstitution, in the matter of reporting ortaking promptaction to preventanincident of ragging or who display an apathetic or insensitive attitude towards complaints of ragging, or who fail to take timely steps, whether required under these Regulations of otherwise, to prevent an incident or incidents of ragging, then such authority shall initiate departmental disciplinary action, in accordance with the prescribed procedure of the institution, against such member of the faulty or staff.
 - Providedthatwheresuchlapseisattributabletothe Head oftheinstitution, theauthoritydesignatedtoappointsuch Head shalltake suchdepartmentaldisciplinaryaction; and suchaction shall be without prejudice to any action that may be taken under the penallaws for a bet mento fragging for failure to take timely steps in the prevention of ragging or punishing any student found guilty of ragging.
- 9.4 The Commission shall, in respect of any institution thatfails to take adequate stepsto prevent raggingorfails to actin accordance with these Regulations or fails to punish perpetrators or incidents of ragging suitably, take one of more of the following measures, namely;
 - i. Withdrawal of declaration of fitness to receive grants under section 12B of the Act.
 - ii. Withholding any grant allocated.

- iii. Declaring the institution ineligible for consideration for any assistance under any of the general or special assistance programmes of the Commission.
- iv. Informing the general public, including potential candidates for admission, through a notice displayed prominently in the newspaper or other suitable media and posted on the website of the Commission, declaring that the institution does not possess the minimum academic standards.
- v. Takingsuch otheraction within its powersasitmay deem fitand impose such other penalties as may be provided in the Actfor suchduration of time asthe institution complies withthe provisionsof these Regulations.

Provided that the action taken under this clause by the Commission against any institution shall be shared with all Councils.
